SUBJECT: Utqiagvik – Monthly Report February 2024

From January 15, 2024 to February 15, 2024, North Slope Borough Dispatch in Utgiagvik recorded 843 calls for service.

Of the _843_ calls for Police service: _810_ were dispatched

- 84 were called in on 9-1-1
- 20 were in-person
- 327 were officer-initiated contacts
- 285 were called in on the non-emergency line

191 calls for service for the following

- 15 arrests were made (Adults)
- 01 was a Warrant Arrest
- 31 were Domestic Violence Related
- 10 were Drug Related
- 73 were Alcohol Related
- 01 Juvenile Arrests
- 00 were Detoxed
- 00 Incidents involved Taxi Cabs
- 146 were Non-Criminal in nature
- 5 were Mental Health related

Drug and Alcohol Seizures:

During the month there was 1 incident where alcoholic beverages were seized and placed into evidence. In that case, 11 x 750 ml bottles of distilled liquor were seized totaling 8.25 liters. The estimated value if sold is \$1,100. This case was a result of cooperation with another law enforcement group in Anchorage.

During the month there were 0 incidents where drugs were seized and placed into evidence.

Note: these figures presented are only on cases that are closed and forwarded for prosecution; they don't include active investigations or joint investigations with other agencies.

The Police Department encourages the willingness of citizens to assist us in the "War On Drugs" campaign. The majority of the information gathered comes from <u>YOU</u>. We encourage all community members to report illegal use or sale of drugs and alcohol in our villages, to either the local Police Department, Police Dispatch 907-852-6111. or the Hotline at 1-800-478-3784.
